**Cllr Mastertons Report**

Cllr Masterton had contacted NLC regarding the amount of litter lying in Glen Road. It was confirmed that all the areas in the village had been cleared and two litter pickers had been seen by members of the committee on their regular round on Tuesdays.

Residents in the Shorewood Estate have been notified of Scottish Water adopting the pumping station in Abbots Court in the near future.

There is a Special Council meeting on 15 February on the findings of the Savings Initiative. The Council Tax remains frozen.

**Any Other Business**

Mrs Kennedy reported areas at Broadwood Loch that are in need of attention. M Smillie was familiar with this as she was involved in a survey of the Loch when she was secretary of the Cumbernauld Environmental Society. Work to improve drainage around the footpaths near the car park and general upgrading of footpaths around the loch are proposed in the near future.

Mr Wright noted that the children's play area was in a very wet condition. This was due partly to the area flooding in the recent storms. This play area is maintained by NLC and is listed on the NLC play area list. He also reported that a mandate for drainage work had been received by the residents of Westerton Road and Antonine Road; costs varied from £3,5000.00 to £15 -16,000.00. Cllr Masterton advised that Mr Wright contacts J Ashcroft for advice.
